Affordable Housing Europe. Hybrid Governance and Financing Models

In several European countries, flexible strategies are applied in the design and management of atfordable housing projects. Through the integration of social and functional features, the creation of a sense of identity and the provision of community facilities, the challenge of current innovation is mainly concentrated in the improvement of inclusive urban policies, leading to a higher urban liveability.

In Italy the housing pressure is extremely high, and goes hand in hand with the increasing difficulties generated by local governments' budget cuts. In the absence of a national policy, locally developed policies and projects have experimented different degrees of innovation, stemming from different roots, so to expand the supply of the rental affordable market and to enhance the construction of a community welfare. A variety of experiences involve different tools to design both the new housing neighbourhoods and to reuse and regenerate parts of the (underused or unsold) private and public stock, a huge legacy from the past.
